POST-CONFERENCE GHANA WORKSHOP

OCTOBER 14, 2022

INTRODUCTION

Ghana is considered as one of the leading countries in Sub-Sahara Africa with significant progress towards clean cooking access for its population. Between 2010 and 2021, the country successfully doubled domestic LPG use from 18.2% to 36.9% while at same time cut down reliance on solid biomass (charcoal and firewood) for cooking fuels from 71.3% of Ghanaian households to 56.9%. During this period also, the country has witnessed the deployment of about two million improved biomass cookstoves for both domestic and productive purposes. Despite the evident progress made over the last decade, much is still required to ensure the delivery of the country's commitments and targets for clean fuel access and universal adoption of clean cooking by 2030.

The opportunity for Ghana to host the CCA flagship event; The Clean Cooking Forum 2022, must be followed with immediate action to keep the country on track for delivery of its commitments and targets. This action must see the country re-evaluating and re-stating its status against new global frameworks and perspectives shared at the Forum, which is scheduled for October 11-13, 2022. The action must further involve re-assessment and re-defining additional measures and strategies for enhancing government actions and market response to keep up the pace of new demands and emerging potentials and prospects of the clean cooking industry. The "Post-Conference Ghana Workshop" is therefore, proposed to give Ghana the opportunity to take immediate action based on the new learnings, lessons and recommendations from the global audience assembled by the Forum, to re-position the nation for more vibrancy in clean cooking leadership.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the "Post-Conference Ghana Workshop" is to create opportunity for the Government, together with its local and Global partners and stakeholders to reflect on the new perspectives, frameworks and recommendations of the Forum, to strengthen the country's position and strategies for harnessing new investments/financing and partnership opportunities for accelerating the achievement of the country's clean cooking targets.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The specific objectives of the Post-Conference Ghana Workshop are:

- Reflect on Global perspectives, opportunities and initiatives and identify strategies for leveraging these for accelerating nation efforts
- Re-assess country progress on policy/regulation and strategies for market development for expanding access to clean cooking;
- Review current efforts on Article 6 of the Paris Agreement to increase access to the global carbon market;
- Assess Ghana's clean fuel potentials and opportunities; electricity for cooking, ethanol, biogas and alternative solid fuel (briquettes & pellets from agro-wastes)
- Strengthen existing institutional framework for delivery of Technical Assistance and Business Advisory Services to the clean cooking industry;

EXPECTED RESULTS:

The expected results of the Ghana workshop are:

- Additional policy measures and strategies for enhancing market development and expanding access to clean cooking, are identified for adoption by government and its partners and stakeholders;
- Government intentions and frameworks for accessing financing under the Article 6 of the Paris Agreement is shared with stakeholders and partners;
- Government and partners are better informed about prospects of electric cooking, ethanol, biogas and briquettes and recommendations for deploying these fuels;
- Recommendations for strengthening institutional arrangements for delivery of Technical Assistance and Business Advisory Services offered to government and partners.
